Suggestion – create an email that has a clear name showing where it is coming from

Which Council? Sylvan Lake

Suggestion – create the email using Gmail. Gmail is a free secure email service. Less likely of getting hacked when using Gmail due to their strong security.

Mail

Have the CWL mail go to the parish.

> Easy for new and old members to contact your parishes CWL

For the sender information, use "CWL President" or "CWL Treasurer".

>Contact information stays the same year over year.

Video

- >Make the monthly gatherings FUN!!




