SOCIAL JUSTICE

Edmonton Diocesan CWL is supporting the IWIN Initiative <http://www.iwininitiative.ca/>.

IWIN Initiative works with human trafficking investigators, provides backpacks to survivors who are entering a wrap-around program to support them emotionally, physically and spiritually. The backpacks, containing all brand-new items, include a change of clothes, toiletry items, a handwritten card of encouragement and a bracelet. A matching bracelet is given to a volunteer prayer warrior to support the survivor through prayer.

IWIN also raises awareness about the atrocity of human trafficking and its prevalence right here in our home country of Canada by providing volunteers with the opportunity to participate in a Red Sand Prayer Service.

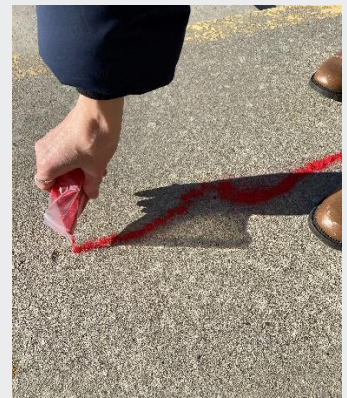

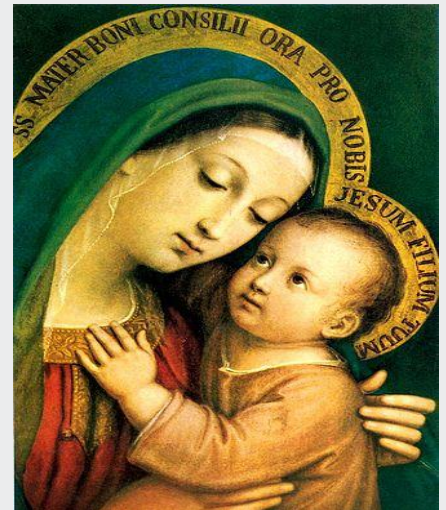
Our Lady of Good Council

Our Lady of Good Council was a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary after a painting, that is said to be miraculous.

In a small church in Albania, two young men had a dream in which Mary told them to leave the country. She said the painting would depart and that they must follow the painting wherever it went. They followed the painting to Italy where it disappeared. They began searching until they found the old Augustinian church of Santa Maria in Genazzano. In the midst of the festivities for the Feast of Saint Mark, the townsfolk suddenly heard "exquisite music." A mysterious cloud was then said to have descended on the unfinished wall of the parish church; the cloud dissipated and a beautiful fresco, no more than eighteen inches square, of the Virgin Mary and the Christ Child was revealed. It was widely believed that it had been miraculously transported from a church in Scutari, Albania.
